New Festival, Installations & 100 Years of Filming at Old Royal Naval College, London

In 2025, the Old Royal Naval College reaffirms its place as a cultural hub, offering a vibrant programme of events that blend history, culture and wellbeing. From awe-inspiring installations and heritage tours to dynamic festivals, family days out and activities that stimulate wellness, the UNESCO World Heritage Site continues its mission to provide enriching cultural experiences for all.

To kick off the year, visitors to the magnificent Painted Hall will have a final chance to bask in the beauty of Luke Jerram's Mars installation, before it closes on 20th January. To mark its departure and combat January's Blue Monday with the perfect night out for Dry January, the Old Royal Naval College will host *Eyes on Mars: A Cultural and Scientific Exploration Talk*, where Imperial College's Professor Gupta will delve into the Mars Rover mission, complemented by opportunities to observe Mars through telescopes on a dry January evening. For those seeking mindfulness, the Old Royal Naval College's ever-popular wellbeing programme offers a serene Mars Flow Yoga and Brunch session under the planetary installation.

This dedication to wellbeing continues throughout the year, with regular initiatives designed to uplift and inspire. Feel Good Fridays held on the last Friday of every month provide a dose of joy and relaxation. Meanwhile, in its commitment to opening access

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to wider audiences and offering free entry for children every day, First Sundays invite visitors to engage with the site's rich history for a £5 admissions entry.

Foodies will also be able to savour a sustainable dining experience on 25th January in the Painted Hall with celebrated chef Douglas McMaster, world-renowned for his pioneering zero-waste restaurant, Silo.

In addition to the site's cultural programme, the Old Royal Naval College, the UK's number 1 heritage film location, celebrates 100 years of filming in 2025. The 1925 silent film, *Sons of the Sea* by H. Bruce Woolfe about two boys in the Royal Navy was the first production on site.

Following the success of *Mars*, be the first to see Luke Jerram's newest and most ambitious artwork, *Helios*, at its London première. 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2025 at Royal Museums Greenwich

2025 at Royal Museums Greenwich will see the opening of a new major exhibition *Pirates* in March, which traces the changing depictions of pirates through the ages. The Royal Observatory Greenwich will be celebrating its 350th anniversary with a year-long calendar of public events including activities, talks and special planetarium shows. The mesmerising *Astronomy Photographer of the Year* exhibition will return to the National Maritime Museum in September, displaying another year of breathtaking space images.

Pirates, National Maritime Museum, 29th March 2025

In March 2025 the major exhibition *Pirates* will open at the National Maritime Museum tracing the changing depictions of pirates through the ages and revealing the brutal history obscured by fiction. Whether as comical characters, like Captain Pugwash, villains like Captain Hook and Long John Silver or anti-heroes like Captain Jack Sparrow, pirates have captured the imagination for generations. Covering theatre, film and fashion the exhibition brings together material from early literature on piracy in the eighteenth-century, to 1980s haute couture.

While often portrayed as tricksters or scoundrels pirates are primarily depicted as swashbuckling adventurers associated with lush islands, flamboyant dress and

buried treasure. Pirates will deconstruct these myths and illuminate the realities of pirate life, including the pirates Edward 'Blackbeard' Teach, William Kidd, Anne Bonny and Mary Read.

In Britain today, we think of pirates from the Caribbean seas, but historic piratical activity was far reaching, taking different forms throughout the world. The exhibition will cover piracy across the globe looking at the South China Sea, Indian Ocean and Barbary pirates who operated off the coast of North Africa.

ROG 350, Royal Observatory Greenwich, January 2025

In 2025, the Royal Observatory Greenwich celebrates its 350th anniversary. Founded by Charles II in 1675 to solve the problem of finding longitude at sea and save sailors' lives, the Royal Observatory Greenwich also became the home of Greenwich Mean Time and the Prime Meridian, making it one of the most important historic scientific sites in the world.

In this landmark year, there will be a series of events and activities that celebrate the rich history of the site and the work we do today. 350 years of pioneering research will be celebrated in talks, special planetarium shows, hand-on activities and stargazing events.

Daily tours will also focus on 350 years of the Royal Observatory as a home to the Astronomers Royal and explain how and why the Royal Observatory became the centre of time.

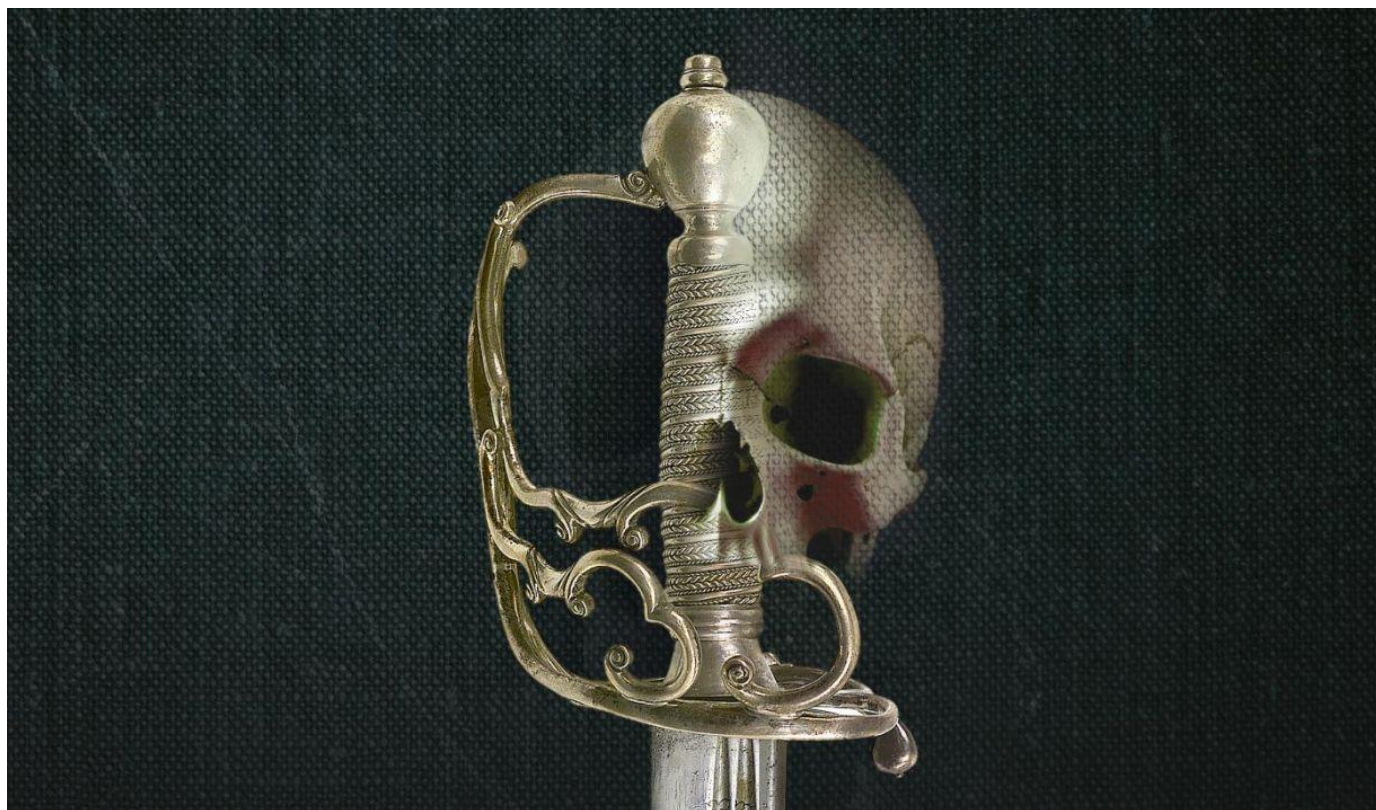
Astronomy Photographer of the Year Exhibition, Royal Observatory Greenwich and National Maritime Museum, September 2025

Astronomy Photographer of the Year returns to the National Maritime Museum in 2025 to celebrate the very best in astrophotography from around the world. The winning images are selected by an expert judging panel, including Royal Observatory Greenwich Astronomers. After the awards are announced in September 2025, winners will be displayed alongside a selection of the shortlist images in a special exhibition at the National Maritime Museum. Now in its seventeenth year, the 2024 competition received over 3,500 entries from enthusiastic amateurs and professional photographers, taken from 58 countries across the globe.

Heroic rascals or violent criminals? Discover the truth behind pirate life in a major new exhibition at the [National Maritime Museum](#).

Pirates exhibition traces the changing depictions of pirates through the ages and reveals the brutal reality behind the fiction.

The exhibition explores the perception of piracy in popular culture – from comical characters like Captain Pugwash and Captain Hook to anti-heroes like Long John Silver and Captain Jack Sparrow – and examines why the idea of a pirate's life still fascinates us today.

While often portrayed as swashbuckling scoundrels, the real history of pirates is far more complex.

Pirates follows the global history of piracy from the South China Sea to the coast of North Africa and explores the issues of modern piracy facing seafarers today. The exhibition illuminates real-life figures, including Edward 'Blackbeard' Teach, William Kidd, Anne Bonny and Mary Read, and reflects on how perceptions of pirates, both past and present, are shifting.

The **National Maritime Museum** hosts the hugely popular annual **Astronomy Photographer of the Year** exhibition featuring the world's greatest space photography in their Photography Gallery.

The Astronomy Photographer of the Year competition is now in its sixteenth year and returns with an expert panel of judges from the worlds of art and astronomy. The winners of the competition's nine categories, two special prizes and the overall winner were announced on 12 September, and are now wonderfully displayed in an exhibition at the National Maritime Museum alongside a selection of exceptional shortlisted images. The competition is run by the Royal Observatory Greenwich, supported by Liberty Specialty Markets and in association with *BBC Sky at Night Magazine*.

Over 100 photographs are on show, displayed at their best on brilliant lightbox screens. The exhibition is free for all visitors to the Museum.

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Celebrating the completion of Greenwich Park Revealed, The Royal Parks



Celebrating the completion of Greenwich Park Revealed, The Royal Parks

After four years, £12 million of investment, plus hard work from staff, volunteers and apprentices, The Royal Parks charity has completed its ambitious, flagship project, **Greenwich Park Revealed**.

The unique, formal landscape of Royal Greenwich Park, commissioned by Charles II in the 17th-century, and designed by French landscape architect André Le Nôtre (best known for designing the gardens of Versailles, outside Paris) has been restored and protected for future generations.

What's new?

The Grand Ascent unveiled

The Grand Ascent – giant, grass steps leading up Observatory Hill to the Royal Observatory – has been returned to its original splendour, while an improved viewing platform by the General Wolfe statue provides a new public piazza for cultural events.

The iconic Pavilion Café renewed

With a new open kitchen, a summer BBQ pop-up area and expansive alfresco dining, the iconic Pavilion Café remains a much-loved stop in Greenwich Park. A new menu with vegan alternatives, nature-inspired interior design, and the Pavilion Kiosk – serving visitors ice creams, and hot and cold drinks – only adds to the buzz. Originally built in 1906, this

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characterful octagonal building – easily recognised by its dovecote – is now restored to its full grandeur.

A liberatory tale: The Ignatius Sancho Café

The 18th century writer, composer and influential abolitionist, Ignatius Sancho once lived by Greenwich Park. Visitors can discover his life story, from a child enslaved in America to becoming the first Black person to vote in Britain (and the first to have his letters published) on a visit to this vibrant community space in what was once a private, residential lodge. The café sits within a new, landscaped community hub and kitchen garden: Vanbrugh Yard.

Greenwich Park Learning Centre goes fully-accessible

A brand-new learning hub in the heart of Greenwich Park, which provides outdoor learning opportunities for schools and community groups, has been built with accessibility, sustainability, and the surrounding landscape in mind. Visitors will find nature trails, a dipping pond, and a wildlife meadow. The nearby former Wildlife Centre building has also been transformed with accessible toilet facilities.

Wildlife habitats revived

Valuable acid grassland habitats have been rejuvenated to support birds and pollinators, such as ground-nesting bees and wasps in Greenwich Park. Plus, the famous Greenwich Park tree avenues, which provide foraging habitats and movement corridors for wildlife, have been renewed.

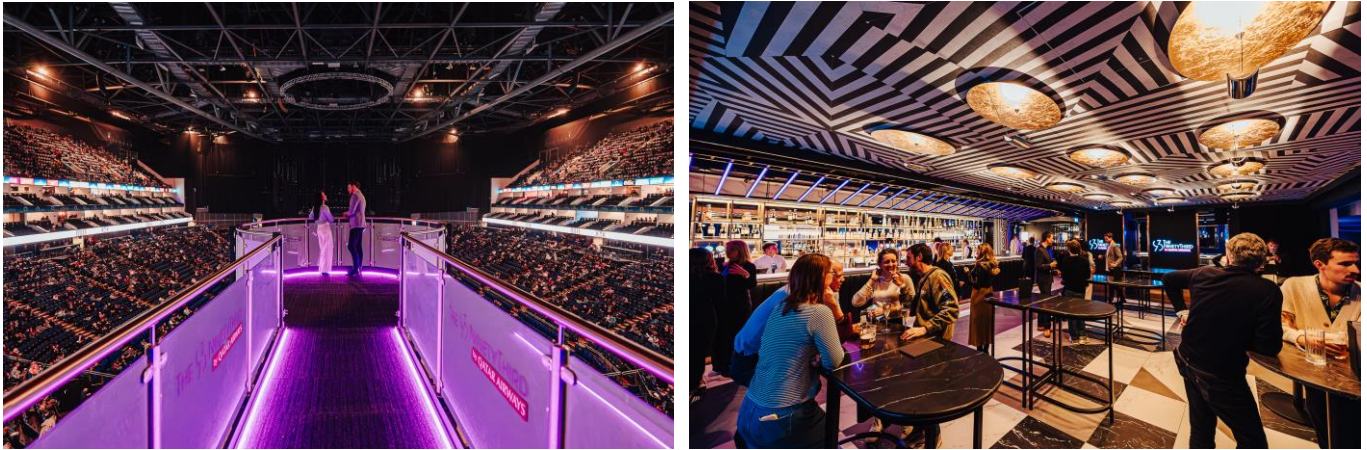
